New classes update

We felt really lucky to be able to share the children's new classes with them today. All children managed to have a lovely session seeing what class they will be in and who their teacher will be.

When thinking about classes, we have to consider a huge amount of information including gender, any additional education needs, ability and social and emotional concerns. We have also, as in previous years, asked the children who they would like to be with.

I believe that the classroom offers an opportunity to develop children's social skills as well as learn, to develop positive relationships with children, who may share different interests, or they may simply have not played with as much before, ideally leading to children at Heath finishing a year with more friends than they thought they had.

As I'm sure you can appreciate, a great deal of consideration is given to the classes and whilst it seems a simple task to move one child, actually, it has a ripple effect on so many children, that this is rarely possible. What we ask is that you are positive with your child about what is a new adventure. We find that whilst most children come back from transition day buzzing about their new class and teacher(s); it is sometimes possible that some will be nervous about the new challenge. However, once they are settled, they tend to be happy with their new class. I hope it goes without saying that should you have concerns in the new school year, you can speak with your child's class teacher.
