



Firstly, thank you to everyone who completed the survey this term. We had a superb response with over 150 people taking the time to share their views. Below is a summary of the results, some of the comments and suggestions made, as well as our initial responses. We will meet as a team, including governors and look to see how we can change to make the school even better for your children.









We have a number of forms of communication in school. Which do you find useful?





Which do you not use?












Do you find the calendar useful or were the lists of dates (that we used to do) a better way of sharing?

Start and end of day procedure Queuing outside of school Can school open the gate slightly earlier to ease congestion. Reception and KS1 using the same queue	We have tried to implement this already. A number of you have asked and it seems to make a huge difference. We try to open the gates early and reception can now queue separately.

Parents evening Can we have more information on our child's progress please Only 10 minutes for the appointments Online great as no queue and we can manage without sourcing babysitters	The dates on the newsletter show we have now booked in parent consultation evening. We are hoping to offer a blended approach moving forward, but it is worth saying that in general appointments are meant to be ten minutes, even face to face, and they often run over. This is what has led to the long delays for many parents in the past.







Some things you have asked other parents to do to make our school safer.

Smoking by the entrance to school:

This is really something our parent can fix, please try to consider the other children and adults on site by moving away from any entrances to smoke/vape.

Parking on Slack Lane: Whilst parking is often an issue in schools it has been incredibly sad how so many have ignored the restrictions on slack lane, especially with the building works going ahead. There are cones out and the disregard for this is difficult to understand. Please can parents try to put the children first and park away from this part of the road.

Some ways we have tried to act already following your suggestions	
You said	We did
I haven't seen a lot of the creative side of the curriculum e.g. music, art, DT. This may not be the case and it is just not shared as well with parents	I think we could share more of the great work our children do. Mrs Wild produces a curriculum newsletter and this has lots of information on this area.
More afterschool clubs	Hopefully we have started to do this, but we will continue to try to put a wider rage of clubs on
Bring back forest schools	Forest schools will be back soon
Learn more about equality issues, including same sex parenting	This is an area we have planned for assemblies, circles in class etc.
More liason with parents of SEND Teacher training on autism	Any parent who feels like they need to please contact the office to arrange a conversation with our SENDco Miss Ward, who is more than happy to try and help. Reassuringly, our staff have regular training including in Autism.
Coming back on to the playground in the mornings.	This is trickier as the restrictions with the building work and space we have add to the other issues.
More equipment at break/lunch such as burpee mats, trampoline and climbing wall Astro turf for football	We are always looking to have more ideas for playtime and will ask the children for their thoughts before we invest.
School needs to take a more leading role against bullying and bad behaviour.	Obviously not everyone has a good experience but if you want to discuss what we do in school to support pupils please don't hesitate to get in touch and arrange a meeting. We are more than happy to outline the plan and strategies in place to support children at Heath.
Introduce greater emphasis on life skills such as critical thinking and debate, money and finance and social responsibility and justice.	A great suggestion and certainly one we strive to do but haven't managed fully yet. Before Covid we had a number of workshops in school, for example from Natwest and hope to restart these soon.
